Encouraging visitors to empathize with the historic agents who worked, lived, and used historic places offers critical opportunities for deep engagement with the past. However, historical empathy – which relies upon both a visitor's ability to imagine historical actors' circumstances, and their ability to constrain those imaginative leaps – remains a challenge for both experts and non-experts to enact. This presentation will discuss research showing how experts (historians) and post-novices (teachers) employ historical empathy differently, and how these examples point to some of the challenges and possibilities that developing successful pedagogy for historical empathy would offer.
